I N T R O D U C T I O N

In 2016, Crime Stoppers USA celebrated 40 years as a nonprofit program helping law enforcement get “bad guys” off the street. The 40th Anniversary USA conference was held in Albuquerque, New Mexico where Crime Stoppers began in July 1976.

Valley Crime Stoppers is a part of that USA family and continues to be a citizen-run nonprofit organization working hard, with the support of our sponsors and media partners, in helping make the Valley a safer place to live. Our Board of Directors is made up of a group of caring business people who come together and donate their time and experience to be a part of bettering our communities. Valley Crime Stoppers is extremely grateful for the generosity and support of our sponsors. These sponsors trust and support the mission of Valley Crime Stoppers and with their continued support, Valley Crime Stoppers has been hard at work doing all we can to support law enforcement and encourage anonymous tips toward arresting criminals.

In 2016 Valley Crime Stoppers increased rewards. The payouts have always been and continue to be based on the severity of the crime, but this year we added in a gang enhancement. If a tipster calls in and gives an anonymous tip against a crime that has gang involvement, then that payout increases anywhere from 50 – 100%.

As we look toward 2017 we will continue our effort to put efforts toward involving and educating valley students about Valley Crime Stoppers. Our increased effort in this area is designed to encourage students on the importance of taking ownership and pride in their schools and educating them about the anonymity of reporting dangerous activity.

On behalf of the Valley Crime Stoppers Board of Directors, we would like to say thank you for believing in us, our mission and for enabling us to assist local law enforcement in making a difference in our communities.

M E D I A P A R T N E R S

Valley Crime Stoppers, a strong crime-fighting partner with law enforcement, could not function without the tremendous support we receive from our media partners. From crime scene reenactments, to most wanted ads and everything in between, our media partners are the engine that makes the wheels turn with power and precision.

On television CBS47 produces and airs Crime Stopper reenactments throughout the day each and every week along with posting those reenactments to the Eyewitness News Facebook page. CBS47 also hosts the current Crime Stoppers app, producing content for the app and promoting the app after each "most wanted" segment in each CBS47 newscast and on air with a 15 second Crime Stoppers app promotional spot. CBS47 Eyewitness News profiles one "most wanted felon" and one "arrest of the day", Monday through Friday at 6pm and 11pm. In addition to all of the above media outreach, CBS47 and KSEE 24 each tag every crime related news story with 498-STOP, and produce Crime Stoppers Public Service Announcement image campaigns and topical campaigns.

In print, The Fresno Bee runs a monthly half-page ad profiling 20-30 of the area's most wanted criminals, runs full page ads about four times per year and when there is a particular need and often directs readers to call the 498-STOP number on pertinent news articles. In addition, Clovis Round-Up, Selma Enterprise, Kerman News, Reedley Exponent, Madera Tribune and Mountain Press all publish monthly most wanted ads specific to their area of distribution.

Our radio partner, Cumulus Broadcasting, also contributes a large amount of air time to Valley Crime Stoppers and consistently promotes the 498-STOP number throughout their station group, which includes KMJ, KISS Country, MEGA 97.9 and Y101 radio stations. On KMJ they broadcast Chief Jerry Dyer's most wanted of the week. Sheriff Margaret Mims' most wanted of the week runs on Mega 97.9 and Clovis Chief Matt Basgall's most wanted runs every other week on KISS Country.

In 2016, Crime Stoppers increased our outreach to the Hispanic community thanks to our Spanish radio partnership with Univision radio. Univision runs three reenactments a day on their three Spanish speaking radio stations, KOND 92.1, KLLC 107.9 and KRDA 107.5.

Our overall advertising campaign work is made possible by our partnership the Jeffrey Scott Agency. They help coordinate placement for paid media campaigns; design artwork for monthly print ads; design and produce all collateral material; design and maintain the website and write, design and distribute all major (and most minor) campaigns.

Valley Crime Stoppers thanks these media partners who annually give upwards of \$300,000. Valley Crime Stoppers has been able to take a large bite out of crime and has received national recognition as a shining example of cooperation centered on one shared goal; keeping our community safe for our citizens. Many criminals are finding out what we know – when our community comes together, they've got nowhere to run and nowhere to hide!

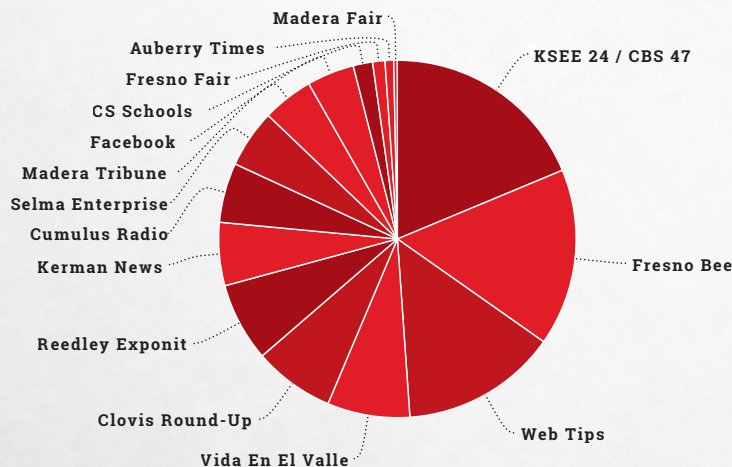

The course gave extensive examination into the mindset of sexually violent individuals from the mouths of those who prey on unsuspecting citizens. Dr. Lawrence J Simon, author of the book "Murder by Numbers: Perspectives on Serial Sexual Violence" has worked in maximum security prisons, including closed management settings and death row and has studied these individuals for years. Dr. Simon was able to discuss the underlying motivations or some of the most bizarre, violent, non-violent and invasive paraphilic behaviors. The course combined the perspectives of psychology and disturbing viewpoints from some of the most dangerous sex offenders and murderers behind bars. The goal was for those in training to significantly increase their awareness and understanding behind some of the vilest sex crimes ever perpetrated.

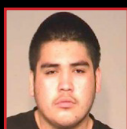

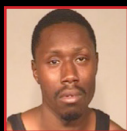

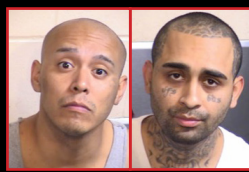
