



SAFE SCHOOLS LOUISIANA PRESENTATIONS

- General Presentation Elementary - This presentation covers a variety of topics like stranger danger, bullying, general safety tips, and internet safety
- General Presentation Middle/High School - This presentation covers a variety of topics such as vaping, bullying, suicide prevention, opioids, sexting, dating violence, sextortion, and school threats.
- Bullying - Students can identify the different types of bullying, how to report bullying, and how to feel empowered to help their classmates in a tough situation.
- Cyber Safety - We discuss the importance of educating our youth on how they should conduct themselves while on the world wide web. Their digital footprint is just as important as their personal reputation.
- Human Trafficking - After attending this session, students can articulate the dangers of human trafficking and the signs of grooming victims.
- Safe Dating - We share the importance of healthy dating relationships as teenagers so that students are not revictimized as adults.
- Drugs & Alcohol - Students learn about the different types of drugs and how drug use can affect them. We discuss vaping, opioids, alcohol, marijuana, and edibles.
- Child Abuse - With the help of the book titled, “My Body Belongs to Me!”, we teach our elementary students how to be in charge of their bodies while feeling empowered to say no to inappropriate and uncomfortable touches.
- Good Citizen - In this presentation, students learn the importance of being a leader in their schools and in the community.
- Safe Schools Louisiana App Training - Students learn how to use the Safe Schools Louisiana App and the importance of anonymous reporting.
- Kindness is Kool - It’s cool to be kind. Not only do students learn why they should be kind to each other, they learn that they should also be kind to themselves. Spreading kindness can help reduce bullying like behavior. In this presentation, we also implement a kindness chain activity.
- Suicide Prevention & Awareness - Sharing the warning signs of depression and suicide can help students identify if a friend or themselves may need to seek professional support for their mental health.
- How to Control Anger & Conflict Resolution - Anger is a normal emotion. We teach our students how to recognize and de-escalate their intense emotions leaving them to make better choices. All conflicts aren’t negative. Some conflicts can help resolve issues.
- Be the Leader You Know You Are: Leadership Training - What makes a person a leader? Who is a good role model and leader? Learn how you can use proven techniques to help lead the team to success and identify your strengths and weaknesses in your leadership journey. This class is suitable for 50 or less students.
